

English 3/4 (10th Grade) - 2020-2021 Course Syllabus - Ms. Naylor - C224

### Units:

Units will include work on grammar, vocabulary, essays, presentations, research projects, collaborative group work, class assignments, quizzes, tests, class discussion, participation, etc.

**First Semester**: In addition to our text (Pearson's *Perspectives*) we will focus on poetry and mythology as well as non-fiction and other supplementary materials. In first semester we usually read the novel *The Alchemist* by Paulo Coelho and/or the play *Antigone* by Sophocles although some of these may change due to distance learning.\*

**Second Semester:** In addition to the text, we usually focus on the novels *Lord of the Flies* and/or *Fahrenheit* 451 as well as a play by Shakespeare\* We will also read a literature circle/independent reading novel.

\*Selections are subject to change. Any changes will be announced in class and made available on Google Classroom.

### **Evaluation and Grades:**

Assignments and quizzes are generally worth 10-40 points. Tests and projects are usually worth 40-100 points. Essays are usually worth 100 points each. The points are totaled at the end of each semester and divided by the number of points possible (there are usually 1,000 points at the end of each semester - this may change due to distance learning). Grade Scale (an 89% is a B):

90 - 100% = A

70 - 79% = C

60 - 69% = D

59% and lower = F

### **Participation Grade:**

Students' participation grades are determined by the following:

- Preparedness: Does the student come to class prepared to learn?
- Engagement: Does the student engage and contribute to class discussions?
- Collaboration: Does the student interact positively with peers?
- Attendance: Does the student arrive to class on time and have few or no unexcused tardies/absences? Students are expected to stay for the entire Zoom class until dismissed.
- Respecting School/Class Rules: Does the student follow school rules including rules for proper netiquette?

Along with a laptop, a notebook is recommended for taking notes for this class by hand.

Daily attendance is important. Please be on time for class.
